Course Description	<p>The face to face course is tailored as an introduction to baking and patisserie, ideal for students wishing to pursue a career in the baking or food industry. The training will give students the opportunity to gain key skills and/or recognition in food handling, food preparation, customer service/selling and barista/café duties. Students will produce quality food and beverage products to serve and sell to staff/students in the Marden Cafeteria one day a week over recess and lunch. Each week students will produce a minimum of two new products and espresso coffee to order over the duration of the service period. A theory session will commence after the students have completed stock-take of product and cleaned the kitchen area. This qualification is current in the national register.</p>		
Pathways	<p>Students have the opportunity to move into further specific study areas of bakery, commercial cookery and food processing, or alternatively undertake relevant apprenticeship training options. Graduates from this qualification may seek employment in the following roles: Café and food operations, Baking and retail baking, Beverages, Kitchen Hand and a range of food processing areas.</p>
